You are requested to complete this worksheet because you reported on your *Free Application for Federal Student Aid* (FAFSA) that you had a conviction for possessing or selling illegal drugs or because you left question 23 blank. Complete this worksheet to determine if you are eligible for federal student aid. Answer the questions below and follow the instructions after each answer. If you need help with this worksheet, or have questions, you may call The Dept. of Education at 1-800-4-FED-AID (1-800-433-3243). These are the possible eligibility results:

“1” means your eligibility for federal student aid is not affected by question 23.

“2” means your drug conviction(s) affect eligibility for federal student aid for part of this school year. You need to tell the financial aid office at your college your “eligibility date” from question 11 on this worksheet to receive federal student aid. You can become eligible earlier in the school year if you complete an acceptable drug rehabilitation program or pass two unannounced drug tests administered by an acceptable drug rehabilitation program. Even if you are not eligible for federal student aid, you may still be eligible for aid from your state or college.

“3” means you are not eligible for federal student aid for this school year unless you complete an acceptable drug rehabilitation program or pass two unannounced drug tests administered by an acceptable drug rehabilitation program. Even if you are not eligible for federal student aid, you may still be eligible for aid from your state or college.

1. Have you ever received federal student aid? Answer “No” if you have never received federal student grants, federal student loans or federal work-study. You should also answer “No” if you have never attended college.

An acceptable drug rehabilitation program must include at least two unannounced drug tests, and: Be qualified to receive funds from a federal, state or local government or from a federally or state-licensed insurance company; or be administered or recognized by a federal, state or local government agency or court, or a federally or state-licensed hospital, health clinic or medical doctor.
