## **EMT Information Sheet – May 2022**

EMT courses are EMS 1021, 1022, 1023, 1024 and 1070.

Congratulations on taking your first step towards becoming an Emergency Medical Technician. We are excited to help you achieve your goals. There are a few things you will need to prepare prior to the start of class to expedite your clinical experience.

- 1. Contact your physician to obtain your shot records.
  - a. MMR x 2
  - b. Hepatitis B series
  - c. TB test within the last year
  - d. Varicella (history of chickenpox or proof of immunization)
  - e. Flu shot between November and March
- 2. If you are unable to obtain your shot records you can see your physician to have a titer drawn.
- 3. You will need to have a current CPR-BLS for the healthcare Provider card prior to attending clinical.
- 4. You will have a background and drug screen prior to attending clinicals. Information will be provided in the first week of class. The cost is \$63 and results must be processed before you can attend clinicals. It is important that you complete the background and drug screen immediately after receiving directions to ensure you have time to complete your clinicals.
  - a. An Applicant will be disqualified from a CCCS program based on the following guidelines:
    - i. Any violent felony convictions of homicide. (No time limit)
    - ii. Crimes of violence (assault, sexual offenses, arson, kidnapping, any crime against an at risk adult or juvenile, etc.) as defined in section 18-1.3-406 C.R.S. in the 10 years immediately preceding the submittal of application.
    - iii. Any offense involving unlawful sexual behavior in the 10 years immediately preceding the submittal of application.
    - iv. Any crime, the underlying basis of which has been found by the court on the record to include an act of domestic violence, as defined in section 18-6-800.3 C.R.S. in the 7 years immediately preceding the submittal of application.
    - v. Any crime of child abuse, as defined in section 18-6-401 C.R.S. in the 7 years immediately preceding the submittal of application.
    - vi. Any crime related to the sale, possession, distribution or transfer of narcotics or controlled substances in the 7 years immediately preceding the submittal of application.
    - vii. Any felony theft crimes in the 7 years immediately preceding the submittal of application.
    - viii. Any misdemeanor theft crimes in the 5 years immediately preceding the submittal of application.
    - ix. Any offense of sexual assault on a client by a psychotherapist, as defined in section 18-3-405.5 C.R.S. in the 7 years immediately preceding the submittal of application.
    - x. Crimes of moral turpitude (prostitution, public lewdness/exposure, etc.) in the 7 years immediately preceding the submittal of application.
    - xi. Registered Sex Offenders. (No time limit)
    - xii. Any offense in another state, the elements of which are substantially similar to the elements of any of the above offenses.
    - xiii. More than one (1) D.U.I. in the 7 years immediately preceding the submittal of application.

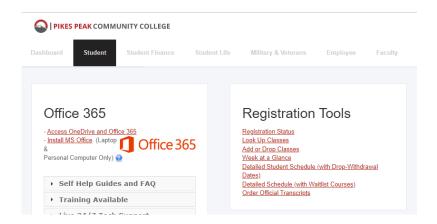

## How to register for EMT certificate courses (EMS 1021, EMS 1022, EMS 1023, EMS 1024, EMS 1070) in the <u>myPPCC student portal</u>

1. After logging into your student portal, go to the **Student** tab at the top of the page. In the **Registration Tools** box, select **Look Up Classes**.

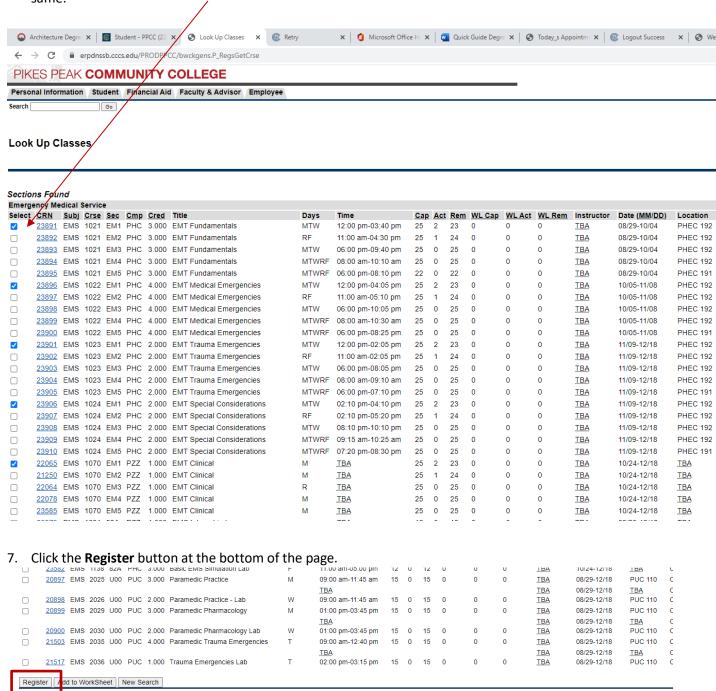


- 2. Select your term and click Submit.
- 3. Select Advanced Search.
- 4. In the **Subject** box, select **Emergency Medical Service**, and then click on **Section Search** at the bottom of the page.
- 5. Select the date and time you want for your EMS 1021. Look at the Section for your EMS 1021.

Make sure EMS 1022, 1023, 1024, and 1070 have the same section numbers (ex: EM1). Look Up Classes



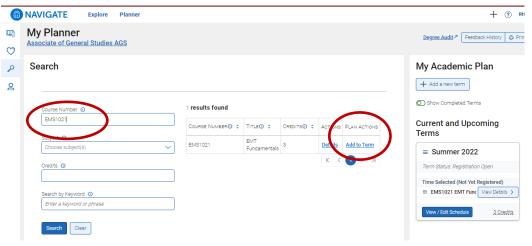
Click on the Select box next to each class for EMS 1021, EMS 1022, EMS 1023, EMS 1024, and EMS 1070 concurrently. Make sure to look at the days/times for all five classes, as they are not all the same.



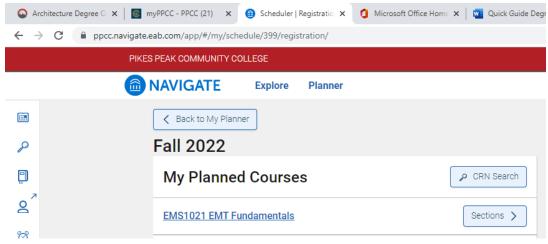
<u>Note</u>: Clinicals hours may not appear on the schedule, as they will be at an off-site location. You will learn more about this during the mandatory EMT orientation. If you go back to the PPCC student portal, select the **Student** tab, and then select **Detailed Student Schedule (with Drop-Withdrawal dates)** under **Registration tools**, your schedule will be displayed with days/times scheduled thus far. ## How to register for EMT courses (EMS 1021, 1022, 1023, 1024, & 1070) <u>In Navigate</u>

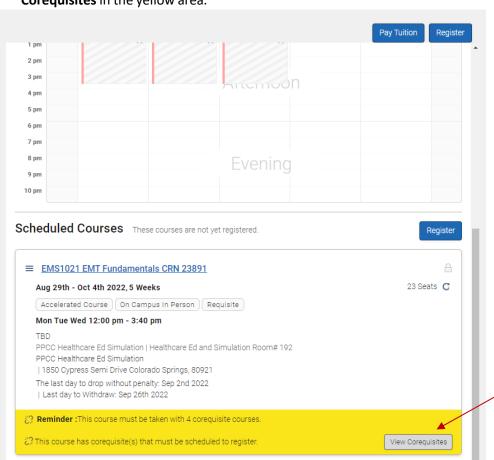
- 1. Open Navigate from your student portal.
- 2. Under the "To Do's" list, be sure to "Accept the Payment Agreement" for each semester. If not, you will be prevented from registering.
- 3. Click the **Planner** link at the top of the page.
- 4. Click **Add a new term** and select the semester for which you wish to register.
- 5. Click on the magnifying glass and it will display a box. Type the course subject and number into the box (must be in caps and no space **EMS1021.** Then enter or click **Search**.
- 6. Click on Add to Term under PLAN ACTIONS.
  - Note: Navigate will prompt you to add the remaining courses in the steps below.
- 7. Click on the semester View/Edit Schedule button.



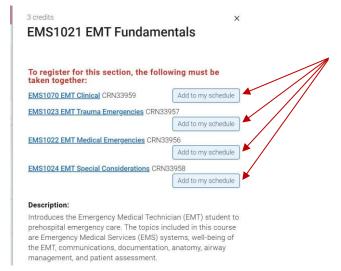
- 8. Click on **Sections** next to EMS1021. Choose the date, time, and location that works best for your schedule by dragging your preferred section of **EMS 1021** into the weekly calendar or click on the three lines on the top left of the class, then click on Add Section.
  - <u>Note</u>: You must take the remaining courses as they are linked (known as co-requisites)
    in the next step. You cannot pick and choose different times as these are all linked to
    clinicals.



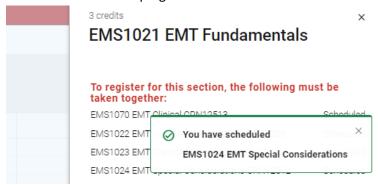
9. To register for the correct co-requisites, scroll down below the calendar on the right and click on **View Corequisites** in the yellow area.



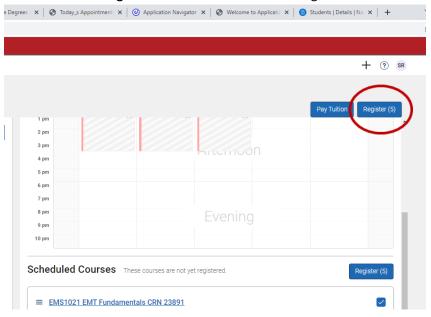
10. Another screen opens showing you what you also need for this program. Click on the **Add to my** schedule button for <u>each</u> class. <u>Note</u>: All of these courses must be taken in the same semester and in the way that they are scheduled.



11. Click on the top right X to return to the calendar screen.



12. Click on the **Register** button on the screen to register for all five EMT classes.
